NEW REGULATION FOR STATE IT SYSTEMS: DISCUSSION ON THE CMU RESOLUTION NO. 205

On 20 March 2025, BRDO experts joined a discussion on the impact of new legislative rules on the digitalisation of government processes at the initiative of the Digital Competence Centre (DCC) of the Ministry of Digital Transformation of Ukraine, GovTech Alliance of Ukraine and the Academy of Electronic Governance and with the support of the Kyiv Global Government Technology centre. The meeting was preceded by the adoption of CMU Resolution No. 205 of 21 February 2025, which should regulate the work of the GovTech sector and facilitate Ukraine's integration into the EU's digital single market. The BRDO team contributed to the draft resolution development as part of the EU4DigitalUA project, funded by the European Union and implemented by FIAP.

HOW EPERMIT SIMPLIFIES LIFE FOR UKRAINIAN ENTREPRENEURS

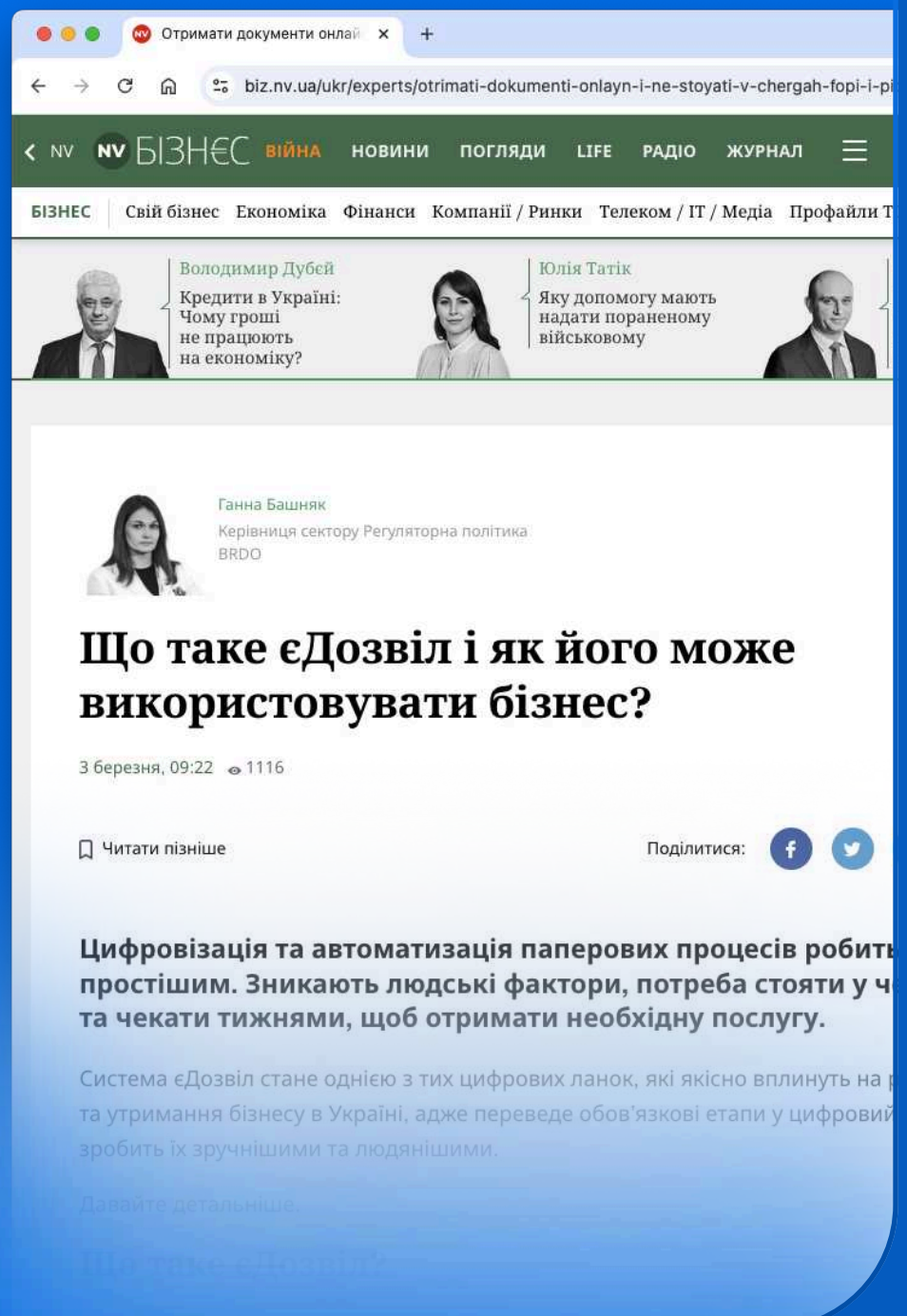
The ePermit system simplifies obtaining licenses and other permits for businesses. The system currently offers services for registering a declaration of compliance of material and technical facilities with the requirements of labour protection legislation and obtaining a conclusion on the payment deadline extension for certain export and import operations. HOW UKRAINE'S FORESTRY SECTOR IS GOING DIGITAL

The efficient and legal use of natural resources directly impacts the country's economy. This is especially critical for Ukraine's forestry sector, where digitalisation can play a key role in tackling the shadow market. During the presentation of the public report by the State Forest Resources Agency of Ukraine, Iryna Gruzinska, BRDO's Agriculture Sector Head, highlighted the positive impact of digitalising forestry permits: around 130,000 logging tickets and certificates of origin for timber and lumber are issued annually.

DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION OF THE MMC: HOW THE MEDICAL EXAMINATION SYSTEM IS CHANGING

The Ministry of Defence of Ukraine, together with the Ministry of Health, is implementing a large-scale reform of military medical commissions (MMC) to improve the process of medical examinations for individuals liable for military service and service members. The reform aims to optimise the work of the MMC, remove bureaucratic obstacles and create convenient conditions for citizens by digitalising procedures and improving the regulatory framework. The digital transformation of the MMC was made possible by amendments to the Order of the Ministry of Defence No. 402, which were developed with the assistance of the BRDO. 301 MONITOR CHANNEL: AI-BASED MONITORING OF COURT RULINGS ON PORNOGRAPHY

As part of the advocacy for the decriminalisation of adult pornography in Ukraine, BRDO has launched the 301 Monitor Telegram channel, which uses artificial intelligence to track court rulings on pornography. The channel automatically monitors new verdicts under Article 301 of the Criminal Code of Ukraine and publishes AI-generated summaries.

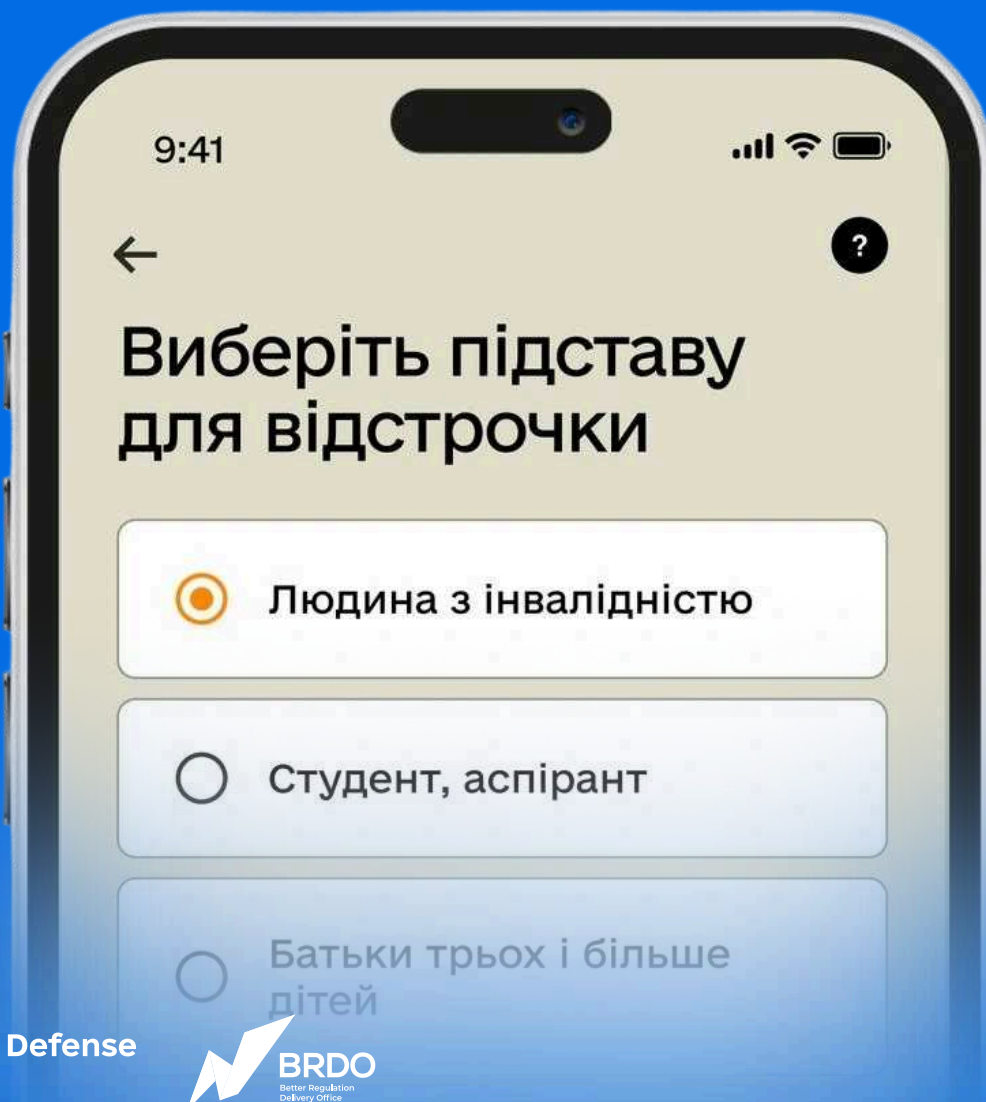

DEFERMENTS FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES WITHOUT A PENSION CERTIFICATE IN RESERVE+

Previously, only people with disabilities who had a Pension Fund of Ukraine (PFU) certificate were eligible for a deferment. [Recent changes](#) were implemented by the Ministry of Defense of Ukraine and the Ministry of Social Policy of Ukraine in cooperation with the German Ministry of Defence, BRDO, and with the support of the European Union under the DT4UA project, implemented by the e-Governance Academy (Estonia).

PUBLIC-PRIVATE DIALOGUE (PPD) AS A DRIVER OF UKRAINE'S ECONOMIC RECOVERY

In 2024, as part of the EU4Business: SME Policies and Institutions Support (SMEPIS) project, implemented by Ecorys in a consortium with GIZ Ukraine, BRDO, and Civitta, and with financial support from the European Union, a study titled "Best PPD Practices in the Context of Ukrainian SMEs" was conducted. The study highlighted the key role of PPD in shaping cooperation policies between the state and businesses. PPD is not just communication—it is a tool for shaping effective policies, improving regulations, and removing barriers to entrepreneurship. 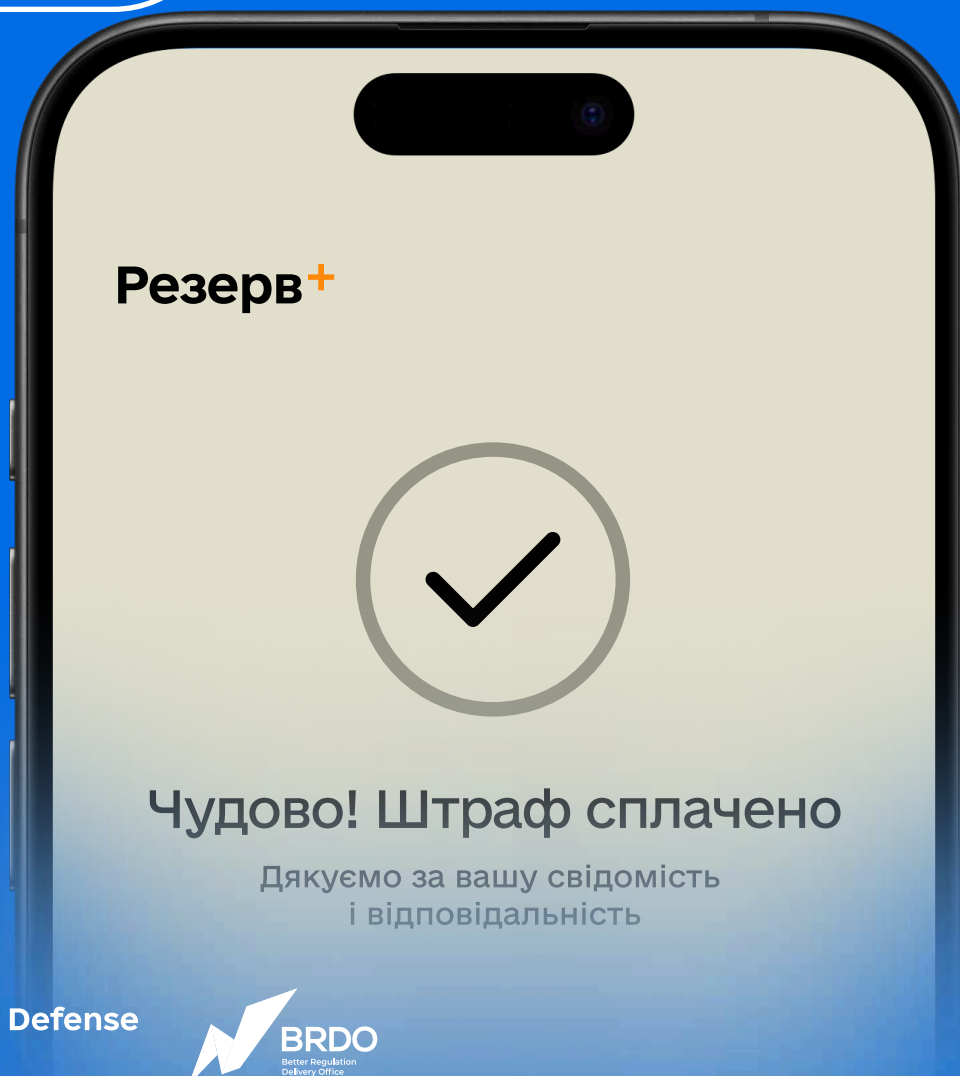

DRAFT LAW NO. 12093: WHAT CHANGES ARE INTRODUCED FOR MILITARY PERSONNEL AND CONSCRIPTS

Military personnel who stood up to defend the country but were unable to update their data on time will no longer have to pay a fine. This is stipulated by Draft Law No. 12093, developed with the participation of BRDO. The law also allows conscripted citizens who missed the deadline for updating their personal information to pay the fine directly in the Rezerv+ app — without bureaucracy or queues at the Territorial Recruitment Centers (TRCs). ONE-YEAR PROBATION AND SMARTPHONE CONFISCATION FOR MANAGING AN ONLYFANS ACCOUNT

BRDO continues its series of materials on court rulings under Article 301 of the Criminal Code of Ukraine, which criminalises pornography. This initiative is part of the campaign supporting Draft Law No. 12191. The latest analysis examines a court ruling in the Dnipropetrovsk region, where a man was sentenced to one year of probation for managing an OnlyFans account.
